Dear House and Senate Budget Leaders:

This letter is an appeal to the Legislature to focus attention on the need to provide significant cost relief to school districts in the 2023-25 supplemental operating budget and set aside all policy proposals that could increase school district operating and capital cost expenditures.

Many school districts have raised concerns about the escalating cost increases they are facing this year. The following charts demonstrate a dramatic shortfall in state funding for the actual costs of paying the day-to-day operations of every school district in this state.

Just to be clear, we are asking you to address gaps in state funding that are forcing districts to use local levy "enrichment" funds to cover the **day-to-day operations** costs of basic education. These are **not salary or enrollment** related costs. Our requests are as follows:

- Increase Materials, Supplies and Operating Costs (MSOC) by approximately \$255 million in a catch-up payment to school districts to cover the 2023 school year, and to cover the expected costs for the current 2024 school year.
- Adjust the school district MSOC funding levels for the upcoming 2024-25 school year in an amount
 that covers the actual projected MSOC costs, not the usual Implicit Price Deflater amount that has
 been used in the past several biennial budgets.

These funding requests are related to the daily costs of operating a school district and maintaining budget stability. These are costs over which districts have absolutely no control, including insurance rate increases, utility rate increases, curriculum cost increases, food and nutrition cost increases, and other costs that are imposed upon us by other entities.

The following charts show the significant shortfall of state funding for utility and insurance rates alone that the Puget Sound area, Grays Harbor County, and Mason County school districts are facing.

They are illustrative of the broader state funding shortfalls in all MSOC categories that are happening all over the state.
